Anna (she/her) is a survivor-advocate based on Gadigal Land. Anna experienced domestic and sexual violence as a young person. With this lived experience, the 22-year-old co-founded and is an inaugural director of The Survivor Hub (TSH). The charity provides holistic peer support to survivors of sexual assault through its MeetUps. MeetUps are located across New South Wales, Victoria and online.

Anna is extremely passionate about the self-determination of survivors. Through her personal advocacy and TSH, Anna empowers survivors to make informed decisions about their healing and is committed to building safe and respectful communities for survivors to connect, vent and ask and answer questions.

Anna is currently studying a Bachelor of Arts and Social Work. Anna also works in disability support, with young people and in aged care. Anna recalls: "I experienced pretty much every kind of abuse you can think of. It was emotional, it was physical. It was even financial, as much as you can be financially abused as a teenager. He tried to stop me talking to my friends. I lost so many friends." She tried to appease him. She made excuses. She loved him.



Glen Fearnett

Glen

A teacher educator for more than 30 years. A survivor of CSA in a government school setting. He told his story to ABC news.

As part of a group of survivors, he spoke out and advocated for survivors of CSA in government schools, which has lead to the formation of the current Victorian Board of Inquiry into abuse at Beaumaris PS and certain other government schools.

He hopes to enable discussion and truth telling to helps other survivors speak up and access support.

Since 2002, Richard has been working tirelessly for abuse victims rights supporting IGFF while dealing with his own historical experiences in the courts for justice and fair compensation.

Tiff is a proud Ambassador for National Survivors' Day and IGFF. She is committed to advocating for improvements to child safety systems and cultures across the nation.

She is determined to use her lived experience to help educate others on the dangers of grooming and use her platform to remind/inform other potential victims that they are not alone and they deserve/have a right to be safe!

She firmly believes that Child Safety is everyone's responsibility and we need to normalise conversations of potential harmful behaviours and ensure we are informed of how to respond appropriately to disclosures to ensure children feel safe to speak.

Tiff was groomed and abused by a notorious offender from age 11, and her brave decision to report her abuse in 2019 helped create Tasmania's Commission of Inquiry and shine a light on the failure to protect children.
